# Summary of the initial meeting of the Association of Surgical Faculty

Dr. Lawrence Field presented the excision of a recurrent basal cell carcinoma of the ala with reconstruction via a flap, a subsequent delayed positive pathology report and then the subsequent redissection of the ala via a lateral rhinotomy and dissection from within the nasal vestibule and repair by graft resulting in a complete reconstruction of the ala.

Dr. Stephen Mandy reviewed in-office analgesia with nisentil and sublimaze and nitrous oxide. Also the use of a sweat band to absorb blood in scalp reductions was presented.

Dr. Sheldon Pollack reported two cases of monilia infection during immediate post-operative period in dermabrasion.

Dr. Ronald Lubritz presented a report of cartilage loss with through and through freezing of a basal cell carcinoma on the ear and resulting deformity.

Dr. Thomas Hill presented two cases of scar revisions.

Dr. Gerald Bernstein presented the treatment of a crythroplasia of quierat with 5FU and its recurrence following that treatment and final repair by chemosurgery involving the urethra.

Dr. Thomas Lyles discussed a nasolacrimal apparatus as it is relates to the treatment of skin cancer of the eyelids. Attention was focused on the compensation for loss of this apparatus as it relates to age.

Dr. Michael Albom discussed the difficulty of moving rhomboid flaps on the scalp.

Dr. Richard Glogau presented the use of a suture sling attaching to bone in order to fix the position of anatomically important structures while wounds heal by secondary intention.

Dr. Samuel Stegman described the use of a "hinge flap repair" of the notched nose following cancer surgery.

This concludes the summary of the Association of Surgical Faculty.
